Born in Kockuk, Iowa, while his parents were enroute from England to Utah, he was the son of Thomas X. Smith and Margaret Gurney. He was born July 4, 1853.

The family first lived in Farm-

The family first lived in Farmington and in the fall of 1880 moved to Logan. Since then Mr. Smith had lived most of his life in Cache county where he took an active and leading part in the upbuilding of cities and communities.

After attending the Logan schools he matriculated in the University of Utah, and then taught the first graded school in Logan. In 1875 when he was only 22 years of age he was called by the Mormon church to become bishop of Faradise. Move ling to that common Ly 2 years, which time he aided and encouraged the settlers in redeeming the waste places. He returned to Logan when he was called to be

come a counselor to President Charles O. Card of the Cache stake. He served as such for seven years and was then called and set apart as president of the Cache stake which then embraced the territory from Avon on the south to Oxford on the north. During his incumbency as stake president he visited every community in the stake with a horse and buggy. For four years he lived in Cardston, Canada, assisting in building up that Mormon community.

For a time he served as postmaster of Logan and was also the local manager of the Consolidated Wagon and Machine company. For several years he was in the grain business but lost everything he had accumulated during the panic of 1907.

To recuperate his lost fortune he went to Alaska where he worked in the gold fields for two mines in Nevada and Idaho.

In the early days he homesteaded the original Logan city cemetery which he later presented to Logan city free of charge.

All his life Mr. Smith has been devoted to his religion and has always taken an active and leading part. Zealously he expounded the principles of his religion, and never wavered even when financia difficulties almost overwhelmed him. During the latter part of his life he was a regular worker at the Logan temple. On the first day that ordinances were performed in the temple in 1884, Mr. Smith officiated at the baptismal for the horse of 7c children, 11 daughters and six sons of whom survive him He is also survived by his widow. If you can get one or two signatures to the enclosed blanks which are for the purpose of securing our permit from the Securities Commission and will have them come back by return mail if possible, it will be fully appreciated.



I thank you sincerely for your congratulatory note concerning my appointment as Undersecretary of State.




