Born: April 27, 1885: Paradise, Cache County, Utah

1885 - 1887: Helena, Montana: (4 months to 2 1/2 years of age) with her parents 1887: Smithfield, Utah: For 3 months; Paradise, Utah: For 3 months, (avoiding Federal Agents) 1888: Spokane, Washington, for 5 months with her father and Mother 1888 - Feb 1893: Cardston, Canada, for 4 years, due to polycamy. (Ellen was ages 4 to 8-years-old) Feb 1893: Logan, Utah, Ellen & her family lived separate from her father and families for awhile Baptized: May 9, 1893 - Logan Temple Logan, Utah 1903: Ellen started College at the B.Y.C., (Brigham Young College), Logan, Utah 1903: TAUGHT SUNDAY SCHOOL IN THE LOCAN 6TH WARD - THREE YEARS (1903-1906) 1904: TAUGHT SUMMER KINDERGARTEN & WAS FIRST COUNSELOR IN YOUNG WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION - (1 YEAR) **1907:** Went to four-years of college, obtained an associate degree in Domestic Sciences at B.Y.C. Married: September 2, 1908 to Walter E. Grant in the Logan Temple, Logan, Utah June 23, 1909: Birth of Evaletta Grant, West Bountiful, Utah 1908-1910: Second, then First Counselor in Young Women's Presidency, West Bountiful Ward 1910 - 1975: JOINED THE LADIES BETTERMENT SOCIETY - (PROMINENT WOMEN WHO LOBBIED FOR CIVIC IMPROVEMENTS) 1910-1912: HOLBROOK, IDAHO WARD, TAUGHT SUNDAY SCHOOL; YOUNG WOMEN'S SECOND COUNSELOR, THEN LATER, FIRST COUNSELOR OF YOUNG WOMENS, THEN PRESIDENT OF YOUNG WOMEN'S ASSOCIATION MARCH I, 1912: BIRTH OF MARY GRANT, WEST BOUNTIFUL, UTAH 1912: MOVED TO WEST BOUNTIFUL, UTAH - TAUCHT BEEHIVE CLASS IN YOUNG WOMEN'S - ONE YEAR **1913:** Active in P.T.A. and Member of National American Mothers 1913 - 1965: WORKED ON THE DAVIS COUNTY REPUBLICAN COMMITTEE 1914 - 1915: TAUCHT RELIEF SOCIETY FOR ONE YEAR April 3, 1915: Birth of W. Eldredge Grant, Jr., West Bountiful, Utah 1915 - 1917: TAUGHT JUNIOR GIRLS IN YOUNG WOMEN'S April 12, 1917: Birth of Helen Grant, West Bountiful, Utah 1917 - 1919: Called As Stake Organizer of the Junior Girls in Young Women's - two years June 5, 1920: Birth of June Grant, West Bountiful, Utah June 27, 1922: Joined D.U.P., (Daughters of Utah Pioneers), Charter Member of John Pack Camp 1922 - 1927: First Vice-Captain, D.U.P. - John Pack Camp Fall of 1923: Charter Member of the Jessamine Literary Club December 4, 1925: Birth of Romania Grant, West Bountiful, Utah 1927 - 1929: Second Counselor in the Stake Young Women's Presidency 1930 - 1932: First Counselor in the Stake Young Women's Presidency 1910 - 1935: SANG IN WARD AND STAKE CHOIRS FOR 25 YEARS May 17, 1927: Birth of Richard Gibbs Grant, West Bountiful, Utah* 1927 - 1932: Worked in the County D.U.P. as First Vice-Captain **1932:** Elected State Parliamentarian for D.U.P. (served for 6 months, resigned to work in the temple) 1932: Ordained as a temple worker in the Salt Lake Temple - served for 25 years until May 12, 1958 1942: Organized the Grant Family Study Group for her children and their families Fall of 1963: Awarded Honorary Golden Gleaner award at 74 years of age 1967 - 1968: Chosen to be "Mother of the Year for Davis County" at 79 years of age Nov 18, 1975: Ellen passed away. She is buried in the Bountiful Memorial Park, Bountiful, Utah (*Woods Cross wasn't incorporated as a city until 1935, so all of Ellen's children were born in West Bountiful.)
